The FWO Scientific Research Network (SRN) "Climate Change Law in Europe - Klimaatveranderingsrecht in Europa" aims to boost and facilitate the development of Climate change law and governance as an autonomous field of legal studies in Flanders (Belgium) and Europe more at large. The network's activities are centered around four key issues:

- 1. A just transition to a low carbon economy.
- 2. Human rights in climate change law.
- 3. Biodiversity protection in climate change law.
- 4. Governance innovation, including climate change litigation, in climate change law.

The network comprises seven research teams in the field of climate law under the coordination of the UHasselt Environmental Law Unit (ELU) (Flanders, Belgium): UGent, Centre for environmental & energy law (Flanders, Belgium); UAntwerpen, Law and Development Research Group (Flanders, Belgium); the Centre for Climate Law and Sustainability Studies (CLASS) (Czech Republic); University of Copenhagen, Centre for International Law and Governance (CILG); University of Eastern Finland (UEF), Centre for Climate Change, Energy and Environmental Law; and University of Strathclyde.

The network's Summer Workshop 2024 intends to bring together senior and junior researchers from all partner institutions to discuss recent developments in climate change law in Europe, foster joint research, and establish connections. The Workshop aims especially at young researchers: post-doctoral researchers and Ph.D.-students.
